## REMODELING THE NITE HUNT HONOR RULES

Can you imagine how nervous I was when I made a suggestion three years ago to the UKC chartered coonhound breed associations that we re-write the UKC nite hunt rules? I mean, that's like tampering with the Holy Grail of our sport! Who messes with something that has been as successful as the UKC Nite Hunt Honor Rules? I was simply asking for their blessing and support in allowing the UKC staff to modernize and re-organize a set of rules which hadn't seen a complete update in more than 50 years.

I'm sure all of you have seen these small, older farm-houses that have been added onto over and over again. Though still functional, they can often end up being a cobbled-up mess. While that may be kind of strong wording to describe the current state of the nite hunt rules, they would certainly benefit from being torn down and rebuilt. But doing so without changing the intent of any of the rules would be no small challenge.

Three years ago this project was approved by the coonhound breed associations. Three years would certainly be enough time to get that project done. Do you remember what happened when given an assignment in school or chores around the house and an ample deadline? When did you eventually start working on it? Correct; some things never change! Allen Gingerich, Paul Frederick and myself finally started working on this project about the first of July this year. We had to actually schedule a weekly meeting to make sure we committed time to get it done! We did get it done, and we did present it to the breed associations at Autumn Oaks and I was even more nervous than I was three years ago when we were simply thinking about doing it.

I can tell you that I now consider this rules re-organization one of the most gratifying projects I've worked on over the years. It sure has been a relief to learn that every hunter who has had a chance to look it over up to this point feels like it is a big improvement. No, it's not as profound as sending a man to the moon, but for a bunch of old country boys, I think Allen, Paul and myself hit a home run with this project. We hope you agree.

I am going to offer below in list form some of the major changes you will first notice. Please, before forming an opinion or heading to a UKC Licensed Nite Hunt, read the new version of the rules in their entirety, as space here does not permit an explanation of all changes.

- The word count for the nite hunt honor rules was reduced from approximately 4,100 words to approximately 3,300 words.
- Rules containing changes from the most recent rule change session will no longer be indicated with an asterisk. Rule changes will be identified and discussed at length in the Coonhound Advisor column and may also be included on the MOH/HD checklist. Instead, an asterisk will be used

- to indicate that a definition pertaining to a rule can be found at the end of the nite hunt rules.
- All rules broken out into bullet points to make individual rules easier to find.
- We incorporated those items previously found in policy boxes at the end of the rules into the appropriate portion of the rules.
- Rule 1 was made into a category specifically for deadlines. We moved portions of the previous Rule 1 into the rulebook under the Club Officer's Guidelines For Conducting Events because they did not deal specifically with a nite hunt cast.
- We moved the previous **Rule 7** (Non-Working Dog Rule) into Rule 2 (Point System) because it deals with the fact that points will be open to other dogs after one hour of hunting time has elapsed.
- We removed from **Rule 3** the clarification that only one tree is counted even if more than one coon is up tree because that is common sense and unnecessary wordage.
- We took the clarification that coon must be seen during shining time out of previous **Rule 8** (Time Out) and included it in Rule 3 (Points Will Be Plus).
- **Rule 4** (Points Will Be Minus) was divided into subsections for strike, tree and other for a more logical order and quicker reference.
- **Previous Rule 4(e)**: "When dog quits trail that is being worked... " becomes Rules 2(d), 4(a) and 4(b) because it was one rule that dealt with many different situations.
- **Previous Rule 6** (Dogs Will Be Scratched) has been renamed "Scratching Offenses" and has been categorized into subsections "Dog Violations" and "Handler Violations" for quicker reference.
- All items found throughout the old rules that were previously referred to as "Implied Scratches" have been moved to Rule 6 (Scratching Offenses).
- Definitions of terms found throughout the rules have been categorized and moved to the end of the rules to rather than repeating the definition from rule to rule.
- We removed the phone-use scratch from **Rule 6** as it becomes a UKC policy situation in which communicating scores is considered event related misconduct and dealt with through misconduct procedures. Removing phone use from Rule 6 *will* permit use of time keeping cell phone applications.
- We moved the 10-minute shining time allotment out of previous **Rule 8** and into Rule 11 (Scoring Dogs; After Arriving At Tree).
- We removed from what was previously **Rule 9** and previous **Rule 17** the clarification that handlers must inform Judges of a dog's peculiarities in order to prevent a dog from being minused in the event it comes a short distance off tree to greet handler.
- **Previous Rule 17** (General Information) becomes Rule 11 (Scoring Dogs) and is broken out into subsections (a) Prior To Arriving At Tree, (b) After Arriving At Tree, and (c) Split Trees, for quicker reference.

- The wordage "A scorecard may be signed still with the right of protest" was removed from **Rule 13** (Scorecards) as it is unnecessary wordage due to the last rule change session which allowed for scorecards to be signed in front of MOH/HD.
- We removed from **Rule 13** the stipulation that required clubs to keep their scorecards on file for one year to be made available to UKC and participants. This policy was unnecessary wordage for the scorecard and has been moved to the Club Officer's Guidelines for conducting events in the Coonhound Rulebook.
- All references to Formal Complaints have been removed. The Formal Complaint process has been revised.

It would be nice to be able to get everything on a smaller card, but even with the reduction of words in the Nite Hunt Honor Rules, we couldn't reduce the size of the card and still make the rules legible. Since we couldn't shrink the scorecard, and since we had remodeled the rules, we decided a total revamp of the front was needed as well.

You will now find your scorecard designed to be tri-folded like a brochure, and it will be pre-folded right from the printer. The front of the scorecard is organized into three sections. The first section could be considered for club use. It still has places to put the entry stickies (which have also been redesigned), but now also has all the event information above the stickies, including cast number, judge, guide, club name, license number, event date, return deadline and time scorecard received. And all of that information can be recorded with the scorecard folded into a third of what was previously required. Think of how much less space that will require on a table during the draw!

The second section will be for judge use in the field and is primarily made up of a strike point column and a tree point column. There is also a line to write in the call name of each dog to prevent from having to flip the card over. At the top of the strike points column, the split points breakdown is in plain view and the blank space for time-keeping notes is available. All of this was designed so that the trifold readily and comfortably fits in your pants, coat or bibs pocket.

The last of the tri-fold sections contains total score blocks, a handler's signature line, and the section to be filled out if a handler leaves the cast early. It also features the photo of the previous World Champion along with the judge's signature line and a space to record coon seen, coon scored and county hunted.

The whole project has been very well-thought-out and we are very proud of the finished product. We hope to have them to all clubs in time for their January events but are somewhat at the mercy of printers and post offices at the time of this writing. We hope that you get out to a club near you to check it out soon. It may not be the best thing since sliced bread but it's pretty darn close if you're a competition coon hunter!
