United Kennel Club Dog Shows are more than just canine beauty contests. At UKC, we embrace our Total Dog philosophy. To earn a coveted Total Dog award, dogs must place in a conformation and performance event during the weekend, which proves them as social and athletic companions while also having the physical traits that identify them as a member of a distinct breed.

- **A. UKC Headquarters.** Come see us for any questions and to pose for your keepsake photo at the Blue Carpet photo booth! Purchase online at ukcdogs.smugmug.com!
- **B. Indoor Conformation Rings.** It may appear that dogs are being judged against one another, but each dog is actually being compared to the written breed standard of the perfect dog for that breed. Each dog is examined by the judge in a posed position, and must also gait in a pattern to allow the judge to evaluate its efficiency of movement.
- **C. Rally Obedience & Obedience.** Rally Obedience is of an uninterrupted performance by the dog and handler without direction from the judge. The dog and handler follow a set of signs and directions to complete the course. Obedience tests the training of dogs as they perform a series of exercises at the command of their handler.
- **D. Barn Hunt.** In Barn Hunt, any breed of dog can race the clock to locate rats (safely enclosed in aerated tubes) hidden in a maze of straw bales.
- **E. Weight Pull** Weight Pull gives dogs an opportunity to perform a function that comes naturally to many dogs, one that they obviously enjoy, pulling!

- F. Outdoor Conformation Rings.
- **G. Disc Dog.** The UpDog Challenge is for any dog who can catch a flying disc!
- **H. Nosework.** Nosework allows dogs to use their natural olfactory abilities to work in partnership with their handler to respond to specific target odors.
- **I. Agility.** Agility Trials are best described as fast-paced obstacle courses for dogs, involving tunnels, jumps and more, all in a race against the clock.
- **J. Dock Jumping**. Dogs compete to see who can jump the farthest and highest off a dock into a huge swimming pool for dogs! It's all safe, and it's all great fun!
- K. Belgian Shepherd Dogs Conformation.
- **L. Lure Coursing.** Racing across a field in the quest of an artificial lure, the first dog across the finish line wins!
- **M. Drag Racing.** Open to any breed under 18 inches, these speedsters charge out of the gate, down a track in pursuit of an artificial lure. The first dog across the finish line wins!
